SUMMARY OF MEDICATION RULES

BLEEDERS:

Registration with the Official Veterinarian for first time bleeders and out of state bleeders must be completed prior to entry time to be added to the California Bleeders list. Bleeder status must be declared at entry time.

Additional bleeder rules and information are listed under CHRB Rule 1845.

PERMITTED MEDICATION:

See CHRB Rule 1844.

COGGINS TEST

Horses shipped from out of state are required to have a current negative Coggins test within the last **six months**. This should accompany a health certificate from an accredited veterinarian.

SHOCK WAVE THERAPY:

All SWT machines are to be registered with the CHRB Official Veterinarian and stored at the equine hospital. The use of SWT machines is limited to veterinarians only. Horses that have had a SWT treatment shall not race for ten days following a treatment. All SWT treatments are to be reported to the CHRB Official Veterinarian on a separate confidential sheet. Any SWT that is not performed within the designated area by the Equine Hospital will result in the confiscation of the machine. Confiscated machines will not be returned until after the close of the meet.

Notice: Anabolic Steroids

The CHRB prohibits all anabolic steroids except as provided in Rule 1844(e). The complete text of Rule 1844 is available on the CHRB website (www.chrb.ca.gov). All anabolic steroids are Class 3 violations and Category B penalties with the exception of boldenone (Equipoise®), nandrolone (Durabolin®), stanozolol (Winstrol®) and testosterone which are Class 4 violations and Category D penalties. Class 3 violations require purse redistribution and a minimum 30 day suspension and \$500 fine absent mitigating and aggravating factors. Class 4 violations call for an official warning which may be placed on the trainer's record.

Horses nominated for stakes in California or otherwise intending to race in California may be eligible for pre-entry urine testing for anabolic steroids. CALIFORNIA'S INCENTIVE PROGRAMS IT PAYS TO BREED AND OWN A CALIFORNIA-BRED



In 2008, the breeders and owners of California-bred Thoroughbreds and the owners of California-based stallions received over \$12 million in premiums through the California Incentive Program. In addition, special racing opportunities afforded California-breds in 2008, by the race-per-day rule at California tracks, provided more than \$16 million in purses for races restricted to California-breds.

As a result of legislation recently amended in 1996, total monies available for incentive awards are distributed as follows: 10% to the California-bred race fund; a 20% bonus on the winner's share to the owner of a California-bred Thoroughbred horse conceived by a registered eligible thoroughbred stallion that finishes first in an open qualifying race, and a 10% bonus on the winner's share to the owner of a California-bred Thoroughbred horse that finishes first in an open qualifying race that was not conceived by a registered eligible thoroughbred stallion. The tracks are adding an additional 10% for Cal-bred winners of allowance races making the bonus 30%. A qualifying race is all non-claiming races excluding stakes with a purse of at least \$15,000, as are open claiming races with a purse of at least \$41,000 at this meeting. After these deductions, 75% of the remainder to be paid as breeder awards, and 25% of the fund to be paid as stallion awards. The legislation also calls for owners awards to be distributed at the same time as the purse, and breeder and stallion awards to be paid once a year, and 2009 awards will be paid during March, 2010.

The breeder of a registered California-bred Thoroughbred will receive a pro-rated share of total monies available for breeders. These awards are payable for finishing first, second, or third in any race run in California, or in a graded stakes outside California, but within the United States.

The owner of a registered California-based stallion will receive a pro-rated share of monies available for stallion owners based upon the earnings of the stallion's California-bred or California-conceived progeny from qualifying wins in California and also for finishing first, second, or third in all stakes within California and graded stakes outside California but within the United States.

The California-bred race fund will provide for the promotion of California-bred races and will provide for or supplement purses for California-bred races.

1. CTBA-TOC Allowance & Overnight Stakes Program

Sixth Race	Allowance
Purse \$59,000 (Plus up to \$17,700 to Cal-Breds) FOR FILLIES AND MARES, THREE YEARS OLD AND UPWARD WHICH ARE NON-WINNERS OF EITHER \$7,500 OTHER THAN MAIDEN, CLAIMING, OR NON-WINNERS OF TWO RACES.	
Three-year olds	120 lbs.
Older	124 lbs
Non-Winners of a race other than maiden or claiming allowed	2 lbs.
Of a race other than claiming	4 lbs.
SIX AND ONE-HALF FURLONGS	

A part of CTBA's & TOC's program to encourage the development of quality Cal-Breds, the \$17,700 (30% of the purse) is the maximum "incentive money" in this race awarded to a Cal-Bred finishing 1st-5th. A Cal-Bred placing 1st-5th will receive and additional 30% of their purse, as follows:

Cal-Breds entered for a claiming price in optional claiming/allowance races are eligible for the CTBA-TOC bonus as described above, Such races will use the 60% purse distribution scale.

2. CTBA Bonus for Specified Claiming Races (60% Purse Distribution Scale)

Purse \$58,000 (Plus up to \$6,960 to Cal-Bred winners from the CBOIF)	
FOR THREE-YEAR-OLDS	124 lbs.
Non-Winners of two races at one mile or over since June 15 allowed of such a race since July 1	2 lbs.
Claiming Price \$62,000 for each \$2,500 to \$55,000 (Maiden or Races when entered for \$50,000 or less not considered.)	4 lbs.
Non-starters for a claiming price of \$32,000 or less in their last three starts preferred.	1 lbs.
ONE MILE AND ONE-SIXTEENTH (On the Turf)	

As part of CTBA's plan to also improve the Cal-Bred program, the \$6,960 from the "Cal-Bred Owners' Incentive Fund" will be awarded in its entirety to a Cal-Bred sired by a registered California stallion winning this race. Such a Cal-Bred would receive \$34,800 (60% of the purse) plus up to \$6,960 (20% of the winner's share of the purse) for a total of \$41,760 A Cal-Bred not sired by a registered California stallion will receive 10% of the winner's share, or \$3,480.

BREEDERS' CUP STAKES PROGRAM



The Breeders' Cup provides Thoroughbred racing's only year-round national stakes program. In addition to providing racing's year-end championships, Breeders' Cup Limited funds an extensive number of stakes races throughout the year. Owners and nominators of Breeders' Cup horses can earn additional purse money in Breeders' Cup Stakes races at tracks across the United States and Canada. These purse enhancements are generated by the annual nominations of stallions and the one-time nomination of foals.

Breeders' Cup funds will be paid out in accordance with the track's normal purse distribution schedule. For example, if the track's purse is paid down five places, then the Breeders' Cup amount will also be paid down five places. Only Breeders' Cup-nominated horses will be eligible to run for the additional Breeders' Cup funds. Unearned Breeders' Cup funds revert back to Breeders' Cup Limited.

In addition to the purse payouts a 5% Nominator Award will be paid to the foal of a Breeders' Cup-nominated horse which finished first, second or third. A 5% stallion nominator award will be paid to the nominator of a Breeders' Cup stallion regardless of the nominations status of a horse finishing first, second or third. A 2.5% nominator award will be paid to the nominator of a BCL/EBF common fund stallion. These awards are distributed by Breeders' Cup Limited. Owners' purse money is distributed by the track and included in the lifetime earnings of the horse. The winning owner is presented with a trophy from Breeders' Cup Limited.
