CALIFORNIA THOROUGHBRED TRAINERS (CTT)



The California Thoroughbred Trainers (CTT) is a state authorized organization formed for the purpose of representing the best interests of its member trainers in dealing with the California Horse Racing Board, the racing associations, and the general public.

In that role, the CTT communicates trainers' perspectives, complaints, and suggestions regarding backstretch conditions and facilities, racing surfaces, racing dates, medication rules, security rules, and a myriad of other issues facing the industry. These issues and many others are dealt with through negotiations at the CHRB level, as well as in the contracts that the CTT and the racing associations sign prior

to each meet. The CTT also provides seminars and materials for its members on matters affecting the industry.

The organization administers a pension fund with assets over \$31 million. The Plan supplies benefits to all those qualified workers and trainers who are responsible for the care and training of racing thoroughbreds. There are currently approximately 800 retirees collecting monthly benefits and over 2,800 participants in the Plan.

The CTT also provides education and recreation programs for backstretch workers and their families. These programs include English as a Second Language classes, sports leagues, recreational outings, picnics, and holiday parties for Christmas, Easter, and Thanksgiving. As a part of the annual Christmas celebration, the CTT provides gifts for workers and their children. The CTT also operates low-cost snack shops on the backstretch at three California racetracks. Through our charitable organization, the Edwin J. Gregson Foundation, we also provide college scholarships to the children of California stable area personnel.

In addition thereto, the CTT provides administrative services for the industries' captive insurance program through the California Horsemen's Safety Alliance (CHSA) and the California Thoroughbred Business League (CTBL).

With offices located in Northern and Southern California, the CTT is available to answer questions and assist the public with matters involving everything from selecting a trainer to finding a job on the backstretch. California Retirement Management Account

California Retirement Management Account (CARMA) is a non-profit, charitable organization created to raise money for retired racehorses. It is responsible for hosting fundraising events, educating owners and trainers on equine retirement and working to unifying the industry in support of our equine athletes. In addition, CARMA has worked with the CHRB to adopt a rule change allowing for a 0.3% deduction from purses to help fund equine retirement. This deduction, one owners can opt-out of, will be used to help support equine retirement farms that care for and retrain retired Thoroughbred racehorses. Owners can obtain opt-out forms at any of the paymaster offices in California or at www.chrb.ca.gov.

CARMA was created to assist Thoroughbred retirement facilities that care for and retrain horses whose careers have ended after competing in California Thoroughbred races. It will manage a grant request process and disburse funds to qualified retirement facilities caring for such horses.
